

INSTALLATION STEPS

- 1. This hitch will bolt to the bottom of the metal reinforcement beam inside the rear bumper and also to the tie down loop at the center of the car's floor. Two existing weldnuts are found at the bottom of the beam.
- 2. Loosely bolt the hitch as shown in the diagram. Install fasteners through the tow loop as shown. The hitch should fit to the right (passenger) side of the tow loop.
- 3. Place round spacer into tie down loop and adjust for alignment for holes in the bumper bracket. The hole in the spacer is eccentric for this purpose. Assemble the balance of the fasteners as shown. The car's tie down loop must be sandwiched between the hitch plate and the square backing plate.
- 4. Torque all 1/2" fastener to 110 lb-ft, and 10mm fasteners to 48 lb-ft.

PERIODICALLY CHECK THIS RECEIVER HITCH TO ENSURE THAT ALL FASTENERS ARE TIGHT AND THAT ALL STRUCTURAL COMPONENTS ARE SOUND.
